



#### **President Games for History or Social Studies Centers**

**Presidents Matching Game:** Please visit the "Free Teaching Materials" page of the Habakkuk Educational Materials website at <a href="https://www.habakkuk.net/">https://www.habakkuk.net/</a> and click on "Reproducible President Cards." The cards should be printed on white cardstock and cut out. If you want to use them as flashcards, fold the cards on the center dotted line so that the president's picture is on the front and his name and the year in which he served is on the back. If you want to use them as a matching game, cut the cards in half and keep in a Ziploc bag. The cards are placed face down on the table, and a child chooses two cards in an attempt to match a picture of a president with his name (or with the same picture if you have prepared doubles). If a match is made, the child removes the cards and holds onto them until the end of the game. If a match is not made, the cards would be returned to their original positions. The winner is the student with the greatest number of pairs after all cards have been removed from the tray.


**Bingo:** Besides the matching cards, there are also a couple of blank bingo grids that you are free to make extra copies of for your class. You might want to give students a list of the president names and let them choose which ones to record randomly in their grids. When the picture of a president is drawn, the child covers the president's name on his or her bingo mat.

**Go Fish:** Deal five cards to each player and place the others in a stack.

Player 1: "Do you have President \_\_\_\_\_?" (Example: If Player 1 has a picture of President George Washington in her set, she might show the card to another player while asking if he has the president's name (or another picture of the president if you have prepared doubles).

<u>Player 2 has the president:</u> Player 2 hands over the card to Player 1. Player 1 keeps the pair and has a second turn.

<u>Player 2 does not have the president:</u> Player 2 says, "Go Fish!" (Player 1 draws a card, and it is player 2's turn.)




